Our palliative care program remains a cornerstone of support, offering comfort and dignity to patients and their family during life's most challenging moments.



MRI Pods Arrive at Brockville General!



After 10 days, more than 1,700 kilometers, and the transportation of two 130-foot tractor-trailers, the two specially designed building units for the new Brockville General Hospital MRI arrived on March 23rd. Each unit, weighing approximately 110,000 pounds, was carefully lifted into place by crane throughout the day. With both units now on-site, the next phase of connecting electricity and plumbing to the hospital has begun.

The state-of-the-art machine, and the renovations to the entire department, were made possible by generous donations from the community!

MRI Scanner is Installed



On April 29, Brockville General Hospital successfully installed its new 4.2-ton Siemens MRI scanner, marking a significant milestone for the hospital and the community. The scanner, transported from Germany, was moved into the MRI suite through a specially designed hatch using a temporary bridge. Thanks to the efforts of the hospital staff, the Brockville and District Hospital Foundation, Siemens Canada, SDI Canada, and generous donors, the MRI is set to be operational by May, with local referrals beginning in July. Brockville General is the first hospital in

Ontario to use a medical-grade modular building for its MRI, a project completed in under eight months. This modular approach minimized disruption, with the installation proceeding smoothly and on schedule.



MAY



The Brockville & District Hospital Foundation (BDHF) announced on Tuesday that their 4th annual Ride the River in support of the Brockville General Hospital raised a 'staggering' \$544,455.20 surpassing their goal.

The event was held on Sunday, May 26th starting out from Brown's Bay.


